Re: EPA's Clean Water Rule

Dear Senator Klobuchar:

On behalf of the 26 undersigned organizations representing environmental, conservation and civic groups from across Minnesota, we write to express our gratitude for your firm opposition to polluters' latest attempt to derail the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) newly approved Clean Water Rule. The so-called Barasso bill (S.1140) would strip the EPA of its ability to use best-available peer-reviewed science to restore federal protection over thousands of waterways in Minnesota and across the nation. We are also writing to ask for your continued support of the Clean Water Rule on behalf of the 1 in 6 Minnesotans whose drinking water sources would be better protected.

The Clean Water Rule finalized in May is supported by over 1,200 peer-reviewed studies and the EPA's Science Advisory Board, a public advisory group that provides balanced, expert assessment of scientific matters to the EPA. The rigorous legal and scientific background that went into the development of the rule ensured that the final result represents a balanced approach to the protection of our Nation's waters. The agencies also engaged in a very transparent public review process. Over 800,000 members of the public commented in support of the new Clean Water Rule protections, representing over 80% of the comments received by the EPA.

What does this rule mean for Minnesota? The rule restores protections to more than half of our streams, including those that feed our iconic waters - like the Mississippi, Red River and Lake Superior - and help provide drinking water to nearly 1 million Minnesotans. It also clarifies protection of wetlands that are adjacent to navigable waters. And in an important step to protect our state's at-risk prairie pothole wetlands (wetlands that provide vital habitat for birds and significant water quality services), the rule would allow for their protection based on an analysis whether they significantly impact downstream water conditions in the watersheds in which they're located.

For all these reasons, supporters of the Clean Water Rule here in Minnesota include small businesses, local elected officials, conservation and sportsmen's organizations.

While we deeply appreciate your clear opposition to S.1140, we know that allies of polluting industries are formulating several other measures to block the Clean Water Rule in Congress this

summer. As suggested by your public statement on S.1140, the proper places for resolving any remaining issues pertaining to Clean Water Act jurisdiction are within EPA and the Corps, not Capitol Hill.

In line with this thinking, we urge you to publicly reject any further efforts in Congress to weaken, delay, or otherwise derail the Clean Water Rule. Only such a courageous stand by leaders like you will bring Congress back to the business of protecting our waters, rather than assaulting them.
